Dear Mr. Burger:

I was very keen that Henry George should have a hearing in New York, not because I was a Single Taxer (I was not then, nor have I been since),--in other words, not because of the remedy he proposed but because of the power with which he drew attention to the evil.

When the dinner at Delmonico's was proposed, I protested somewhat vigorously. It was, if my memory serves me, to be a ten dollar affair, and I failed to see the propriety of dining luxuriously in order to promote the cause for which Henry George was pleading.
