Tour No. 1

44 Days

Price \$482.00

July 3rd—Sail from New York per S. S. "REPUBLIC".

13th—Due to arrive in Plymouth and proceed by boat-train to London.

ENGLAND

14-15—IN LONDON. One day sight-seeing of city, visiting Trafalgar Square, London Bridge, London Tower, Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey, British Museum, Buckingham Palace, and many other places of interest.

Second day will be at travelers' disposal.

16-17—TWO DAYS' MOTOR COACH TRIP. *London to Harwich, via the Eastern Cathedrals and the Shakespeare Country.*

16th—*1st Day:* After breakfast proceed to Kingston, Hampton Court, Windsor, Maidenhead, Henley-on-Thames, Dorchester, Oxford and Leamington. Dine and spend night.

17th—*2nd Day:* Excursion through the Shakespeare Country, including Stratford-on-Avon, Warwick and Kenilworth, Bedford, Cambridge (Colleges), and Harwich. Continue by night boat for Esbjerg, and by train to Copenhagen.

19th—Arrive in Copenhagen, A. M.

20-30—IN COPENHAGEN.

INDEPENDENT and time at travelers' disposal.

31—By day service to *Berlin*.

GERMANY

August 1-2 *In Berlin.* Morning sightseeing of city, Brandenburg Gate, Royal Palace, Museum, Church, etc. Afternoon free, at travelers' disposal.

One day excursion to Potsdam, by motor boat on River Havel and the Lakes to Glienicke Bridge; car through Potsdam to New Palace, Sans Souci, Parks, etc.

3rd. After breakfast proceed by train to Cologne.

4th. *In Cologne.* Short sightseeing, visiting Cathedral, Roman Walls and Tower, Churches, Roman Fortifications, etc. Continue along the Rhine to *Coblenz*, from where trip is continued by boat on beautiful Rhine, passing various castles, to *Mayence*.

5th. After breakfast proceed by day express to Paris.

FRANCE

6-9 *In Paris.* One day sightseeing of city, visiting the famous Boulevards, Cathedral of Notre Dame, Palace of Justice, the Madeleine, Pantheon, Latin Quarter, Eiffel Tower, Hotel des Invalides (with Tomb of Napoleon), Arc de Triomphe, where "Unknown Soldier" is buried, etc.

One day excursion to Versailles, visiting the Palace and Gardens, the Grand and Petit Trianons, returning via Malmaison, with its memories of Napoleon I and Josephine.

One day excursion to French Battlefields, including Rheims, Chateau Thierry, etc.

August 10. By boat-train to Cherbourg, and sail per S/S "LEVIATHAN".

16. Due to arrive New York.

31. By day express to Edinburgh.

August 1-3. *In Edinburgh.* Half-day sightseeing of city, including visit to Castle, St. Giles, John Knox House, Holyrood Palace, etc.

4. Via the beautiful Trossachs by train, lake steamers and motor coaches to Glasgow.

5. By morning train to Keswick, and by coach via Grasmere and Ambleside to Windermere.

6. *In Windermere.* One-day excursion to the eight lakes, embracing Kirkstone Pass, Ullswater, Derwentwater, Thirlmere and Rydal.

7. By morning train to Chester.

Steamship tickets—round trip, tourist class, on the S. S. "LEVIATHAN" and S. S. "REPUBLIC".

Hotel Accommodations—throughout at comfortable hotels. Room will be assigned on a two in a room basis, without bath. Two meals a day will be included (European breakfast and dinner).

Sightseeing—by motor coaches, with local guides, as specified in the itinerary.

Railway Travel—first-class for the crossing Harwich-Esbjerg, and vice versa; second-class on the continent, and third-class in Great Britain.

Fees and Gratuities—We include those at hotels in Germany and France.

Transfers—from and to stations, docks and hotels.

Arrangements—for entire stay in Copenhagen may be made through the committee at the minimum expense.

Passport Expense: Passports are absolutely essential. American passport, \$10. The visas are as follows: England, \$10; France, \$10; Denmark, \$10; Germany, \$3. Blank applications may be obtained at the Federal Building (P. O.) or by applying to the Clerk of the United States Court nearest your residence.
