GENERAL MEETING OF MEMBERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL UNION

On August 18, 1955, in St. Andrews and during the course of the Conference, there was held a General Meeting of Members of the International Union for Land Value Taxation and Free Trade to transact business relating thereto, including administrative reports, confirmation of the Constitution and the election of the Officers for the ensuing period. Mr. R. D. Young, the Chairman of the Executive Committee, presided. The minutes of the previous general meeting of members of the Union, held at Odense, Denmark, on July 31, 1952, were read and approved. The Constitution was endorsed. The (retiring) President, Mr. J. RUPERT MASON, and the Secretary, Mr. A. W. MADSEN, submitted general reports on the work of the Union during the years that had intervened. The Treasurer, Mr. ASHLEY MITCHELL, submitted the accounts of the Union covering the period of the three years from April 1, 1952, to March 31, 1955. These statements were agreed.

To Mr. Mason, now retiring from the presidency by rotation of that post, a special vote of thanks was accorded for his distinguished and ceaselessly industrious services to the Union, the members paying that tribute by acclamation.

The results of the elections to the Offices are given hereunder, the appointment of Assistant Treasurer and of two joint Assistant Secretaries being made subsequently by the Executive.

The meeting unanimously adopted certain Resolutions which are given textually on another page of this issue of Land & Liberty. These included (1) the "Declaration of Human Rights Based on Equal Freedom," (2) Resolution on "Individual and Common Rights in Land," and (3) Resolution conveying an Address to the General Assembly of the United Nations. It was further resolved that these resolutions be given the widest possible circulation.
