

**BOOKS****THE PROFIT PROBLEM.**

**Pay Day.** By C. Hanford Henderson. Published by Houghton, Mifflin Company, Boston, Mass. 1911. Price, \$1.50 net.

Mr. Henderson thinks that society can be regenerated by the elimination of Profit in "its three forms-rent, interest and dividends." The workman is asked to render "rent" and "interest" and "dividend" inoperative by withdrawing his own labor-power from the field of exploitation; but one naturally wonders how the workman can do this. The individual profit maker is told how to help, but as he must first repent, his co-operation may not go far. Then there is proposed a campaign against rent, by means of a "discrimination tax," its object being "the return of the land to the people and only incidentally the raising of revenue." But just as we are left in ignorance as to how the workman is to get sufficient money to buy a house or a chicken or dairy farm, or as to the best method of turning Rockefeller into a "repentent profit-taker," so we are left without explanation of the "discrimination tax." When one comes to the end of Pay Day, one is in a mental condition to appreciate its assurance that Mr. Henderson's remedy is made public more as a suggestion than as a final pronouncement.
