REV. R. A. TORREY, THE NOTED EVANGELIST, A SINGLE TAXER.

Through the kindness of Mr. Bolton Hall we are permitted to reproduce the following confirmation of a newspaper report attributing to Rev. ft. A. Torrey, the noted Evangelist, whose work in Philadelphia has awakened world wide interest, a sympathy with and belief in our doctrines. Mr. Torrey writes:

"As to the newspaper report of what I said, it is at least substantially correct. It certainly states what I believe. I have said very much the same thing in almost every place where we have held meetings. I read Henry George's works as they came out long ago. To me his arguments were absolutely unanswerable, so there was nothing for me to do but to take my stand upon his theories. I think if we should adopt them it would solve very many of our social problems. It may interest you to know that I had all of Henry George's works placed in the library of the Bible Institute in Chicago. They were furnished by friends in the Single Tax Club in Chicago. I was never able to attend the Club there, for they always met on a night which was my busiest night in the week."

In a second communication in reply to a request for his permission to make public the foregoing, Mr. Torrey writes as follows:

"I cannot see any possible objection in your sending my letter to any Single Tax paper. It was quite well known in Chicago where I lived that I was a Single Taxer."
