Dear Mr. Rees:

Many thanks for your check which was received today. A dollar goes a long way here. No overhead or wages or rent.

I am sending you copy of my little booklet on "The New Political Economy. Also sets of the tracts. I suggest that you make a scrap book of one set of these tracts for posterity for some of the tracts are priceless and can be obtained nowhere else. Enclosed find labels for such scrap book.

It will undoubtedly interest you to know some figures about this work. Since 1932 I have printed 1,470,000 tracts of various sizes. Have sent over 2000 pounds by parcel post in small packages besides thousands of envelopes weighing two, four and six ounces, and to many countries.

For sixteen years till his death in 1952 Dr. Hayes of Waterbury, Conn. was my backer who made possible the publication of tracts above #31. Other than his donations I have received about \$30 per year. The tracts printed on cheap news-print paper were before the Dr. Helped me, at that time, before his helping hand, it was a case of using the news-print or do no printing at all.

I have no record of my sporadic tract printing from 1906 to 1932. I started in N.Y.C., where I was born and have landed here, to which place I came in 1910 to start a National Single-Tax weekly newspaper. Non-support threw me into this cul de sac.
