

PRIZE ESSAYS

(Open for competition to University undergraduates, and students
of Working Men's and Technological Colleges
throughout Australia).

The prize for the first of the annual Essay Competitions has been fixed at ten (10) guineas, the subject chosen being "Land Values Taxation: Its Justification, Expediency, Incidence and Effects." Competing essays are to reach the secretary of the committee, Mr. H. R. F. Chomley, before August 15th, 1910. In subsequent years it is intended to fix a date in March for essays to be sent in, as that date is more convenient for most of the probable competitors. It is hoped that this annual competition may be the means of inducing many students of economics to devote special attention to the question of Land Values Taxation, and to study some of the works of Henry George and Max Hirsch simultaneously with the ordinary economic text books prescribed for examination purposes.
