ROBERT BAKER

ROBERT BAKER, congressman, single tax advocate ; born Bury St. Edmonds, England. Always independently active in politics ; secretary Albany Single Tax Club, 1887 ; later secretary and afterwards president Brooklyn Single Tax League ; six years national committeeman from New York and secretary Single Tax League of United States ; secretary Brooklyn Ballot Reform League ; candidate for assembly, 1894 ; active as speaker in campaign for Bryan, 1896, in Henry George's second campaign for Mayor, 1897 ; secretary Brooklyn Citizens' Union, 1901 ; organized Radical Democracy of Brooklyn, 1902 ; member of Congress, Sixth New York district, 1903-5 ; known as "anti-pass" and "anti-war" Baker. Only outspoken advocate of Governmental Ownership of Railroads in Fifty-Eighth Congress.
