Frederic Cyrus Lebuscher

Frederic Cyrus Lebuscher, noted New York lawyer, has been a follower of Henry George since 1884 and was a close associate of George in the latter's campaigns for land reform. He is the joint author, with the late Louis F. Post, of "An Account of the George-Hewitt Campaign of 1886," an important document in the history of the Georgist movement.

In 1887 he was a candidate for Judge of the Court of General Sessions in New York, running ahead of his ticket. He served as president of the Manhattan Single Tax Club, founded by Henry George, for five years.

Throughout his life he has taken an active part in Georgist activities and aided the late Robert Schalkenbach in providing for the establishment of the Foundation which bears the latter's name. He encouraged the late Oscar H. Geiger to establish the Henry George School when Mr. Geiger first broached the proposal to him and was its first president.

Born in New York City in 1858, and will be 80 years of age on September 1st, he passed his early childhood near Brattleboro, Vt., while his father was at the front. He was educated in the New York public schools and at Columbia University and the Columbia Law School.

He has been a member of the board of trustees of the Henry George School since its organization in 1932.
