If there is anyone sitting around doing nothing and earning money it is the land speculator, he is making millions. Unimproved land in downtown Manhattan is \$500 a square foot.

Most of the money that welfare recipients get goes to landlords who let their property run down making no repairs and are unfit homes to live in, they hold the building which has become worthless so they can speculate in the land which gets more and more valuable. Many children have gotten lead poisoning from the antiquated

paint on the wall.

The owner of the old tenement makes more than \$60,000 speculative profit, then the new owner in order to make his investment pay tears the building down and puts up luxury apartments.
