AN ACADEMIC VIEW OF AMERICAN POLITICS.

Political Problems of American Development. By Albert Shaw. Published by the Columbia University Press, New York. 1907. Price, \$1.50 net.

This series of nine lectures was delivered at Columbia University. In a tone of cheerful generalities, historically put and academically worded, there are discussed the chief political problems of our nation.

The author has faith in government regulation rather than government ownership of railroads; regards the acquisition of the Philippines as a wholesome lesson of which we are wisely making the most; hopes for coalition with Canada; and discusses the tariff in learned and on the whole non-committal fashion. While hopefully trusting to our great educational and assimilative powers to settle the bulk of the immigration question, he justifies Asiatic exclusion as a far-sighted policy. The Negro problem he advises leaving largely to the South to solve. Briefly, Dr. Shaw thinks that all things in our democracy are working together for the ultimate best. Unless too closely scrutinized, the volume is soothing. When, however, the author calmly remarks about the transportation question, that "As for the trusts and corporations they have made complete surrender as respects unfair railroad rates," the reader of even so eminent an authority as Dr. Shaw is momentarily startled into skepticism.
