A Word from the Publisher

I provided the materials, but a man named Lee Sei-yol, who has been in the publishing business for years put this together as his first venture in a new publishing firm. He is enthusiastic about it and is promoting it for all he is worth among Christians and political figures. The primary impact is intended for church people, as there is now a very lively interest in the whole issue of church and society, with only left-wingers and do-nothings being heard from up to now. This should fill a gap and provide competition for the "liberation theology" people, who have nothing original but are Marxist-oriented.

Rev. Archer Torrey, who runs the Jesus Abbey in Taebaek, Korea, is author of "Land and Biblical Economics" which first appeared in Land and Liberty magazine and is included in his book. The Henry George Institute published it as a booklet, and the first edition being exhausted, has just published a new expanded edition, with additional chapters provided by Rev. Torrey and an excerpt from The Condition of Labor by Henry George. The booklet reveals how central an issue the land question is throughout the Bible, an element too often neglected in Biblical studies. There have been works on the Bible by Georgists in the past; "The Land and Biblical Economics" is the only such work now in print, and is by one who is both a Georgist and a Christian minister.
